Carolyne-Marie Petch

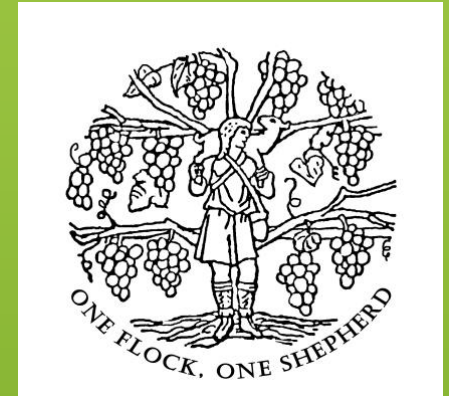

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a Montessori-based religious formation for children starting at the age of 3. It seeks to create and facilitate a sacred, 'hands-on' space for children called an atrium, in which both the children and their catechists can listen, ponder and celebrate the most profound mysteries of the Christian faith as revealed in Scripture and Liturgy.

Founded in Rome by Sofia Cavalletti and Gianna Gobbi almost 60 years ago, the Catechesis continues to spread world-wide and is used by various Christian traditions.

The Level III course builds on the foundation laid by the CGS Level I & II courses. The Level III course will continue to explore the theology and praxis of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd while concretely preparing the participant to develop and facilitate an atrium for 9-12 year old children. At the successful completion of the course the participant will receive the certificate awarded by the Canadian Association of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGSAC) honouring 120 course hours of work.

The focus of Level III is the covenant and how God reveals God's self and is in relationship with us through time: the 'History of the Plan of God'. This theme will be explored through: typological studies of Hebrew Scripture; the History of the Jewish People; a deeper look at Sacraments introduced in Level I & II as well as Confirmation and the Sacrament of the Sick; work on the miracles of Jesus; an expansion of the level II work on maxims which includes an introduction to biblical virtues and a discussion on organizing "going out" events with the Level 3 children.

Course Objectives:

- To present the methodology and guiding principles of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd for the 9-12 year old child.
- To explore the religious nature and the most vital religious needs of the Level III child
- To delve into the mystery of God's covenant relationship with us through Sacred History.
- To reflect on Biblical typology that links the Hebrew and Christians Testament scriptures to Sacred History and Liturgy.
- To enter into the mystery of the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation, Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick with in depth study of the prayers of the Eucharistic Liturgy.
- To understand in the Roman tradition but with an awareness of the material adaptations to the Anglican, Protestant and Orthodox traditions.
- To discuss the challenges of engaging 9-12 year old children in the work of Level III.

Course Expectations:

- Attendance at 100% of all sessions
- Observation in a Montessori classroom or in a 9-12 atrium for minimum of 10 hours
- Completion of personal album pages through hands-on work with materials, individual writing, group discussion and collaboration.

Prerequisites:

Limited to those who participated a minimum of Part 1 in 2016 and/or the 2017 Part 1 & 2 courses.

Auditing

Level 3 catechists are welcome to audit the course. cost: \$100/session plus \$75 if not a member of CGSAC.

Making up days
