

Course Description:

The Level I course lays the foundation of the theology and praxis of the *Catechesis of the Good Shepherd* while concretely preparing the participant to develop and facilitate an atrium for 3-6 year old children.

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a Montessoribased religious formation program for children, beginning at the age of three. It seeks to create and facilitate a sacred, "hands-on" space for children in which both the children and the catechist can hear, ponder and celebrate the most essential mysteries of the Christian faith as revealed in the scriptures and the liturgy.

Each course includes the following features: presentations group discussions, prayer, reflections, observations of children, completion of album pages, materials making, and problem-solving.

A complete course syllabus is available upon request.

Part A of this course will meet for six days, Monday July 9th to Saturday July 14th from 8:30am to 5:00pm. Participants are asked to bring a bagged lunch. Coffee, tea, cold drinks, water and pot-luck snacks will be provided.

Course Objectives:

- To explore the religious nature & most vital needs of the 3-6 year old child
- To present the methodology & guiding principles of the *CGS*
- To broaden the adult's ability to observe & learn from children & to listen with children to scripture
- To meditate on the scriptural & liturgical themes presented to the children.
- To offer guidelines and assistance in preparing the atrium environment, and in making the catechists' album & catechetical material.

Expectation of Participants:

- attendance & participation at all sessions (90 hours total for Parts A and B)
- 10 hours minimum of observation in a level 1 atrium and/or a Montessori classroom for 3-6 year olds
- submission of required album pages

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

The *Catechesis of the Good Shepherd* (*CGS*) is a Christian formation for children ages 3 through 12. Level I is for

children 3-6 years, Level II is for children 6-9 years, and Level III is for children 9-12 years.

In the *Catechesis of the Good Shepherd*, the
prepared environment, is
called the atrium. 'The
atrium is a place of



prayer, in which work and study spontaneously become mediation, contemplation and prayer. It is a place in which the only Teacher is Christ; where both children and adults place themselves in a listening stance before his Word and seek to penetrate the mystery of the Liturgical celebration.

This retreat-like environment is a sacred space where children grow in the knowledge of Jesus' love for them. and are free to work with materials that represent the essence of the Christian message. These hands-on materials encourage children to explore and deepen their experiences at their own pace.

The catechist's role is to prepare the environment and materials; present works that call forth the child's response; then step back, allowing God and the child to work together. The *CGS* requires formation & training for the adult catechists for each level.

The vision for the *CGS* began in Rome in 1954 with Dr. Sofia Cavalletti, a scholar of Hebrew Scripture, and her collaborator, Gianna Gobbi, a Montessori educator. It has now spread to 37 countries around the world, including Canada.
