The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

The Level 2 course lays the foundation of the theory and practices of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd for the 6-9 year old child. This 97+ hour course concretely prepares the adult to develop and facilitate an atrium for this age group.

The focus of Level 2 is the covenant and how God has revealed God's self in relationship with us through time or 'Salvation History.' This theme will be explored through the use of time lines of God's saving presence. We also take a deeper look at the sacraments, and work on the maxims and moral parables of Jesus. Using the text of the True Vine & The Good Shepherd parables we contemplate the question "How am I called to live in covenant relationship?" The course is presented in the Roman Catholic tradition but includes awareness of material adaptations to the Anglican, Lutheran and Orthodox traditions.

Prerequisites

Certificate in Level 1. It is recommended that Part A be completed before attending Part B.

Snacks & Meals

Coffee, cold drinks and water will be provided. Snacks 'pot-luck.' Bring your own lunch. We encourage the use of reusable water bottles.



Expectations

- ❖ 100% attendance and engagement in group discussions, prayer and in simulated presentations using the materials.
